



# FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM




At Hydro we believe in using our energy for good, contributing to a better future in our communities and province. Our Family Scholarship Program is just one way we show this commitment, by supporting the children of our employees as they pursue post-secondary education.

**In 2023, our Family Scholarship Program will award up to 17 \$1,000 scholarships including:**

- ***The Bright Futures Scholarship (up to 14)*** - Open to children of term or permanent employees.
- ***The Jennifer Snow Memorial Scholarship (one)*** - Open to children of term or permanent Churchill Falls employees and/or any student who graduated from Eric G. Lambert School in Churchill Falls.
- ***The Rick Leggo Memorial Scholarship (one)*** - Open to children of term or permanent employees. This scholarship was established in 2018 by the family of long-time Hydro employee and friend, Rick Leggo, in honour of his memory as a caring mentor and someone who generously gave back to others.
- ***The Steve Power Memorial Scholarship (one)*** - Open to children of term or permanent Churchill Falls employees and/or any student who graduated from Eric G. Lambert School in Churchill Falls. This scholarship, formed by his family, was established in memory of long-time employee and former Principal of Eric G. Lambert School, Steve Power, in honour of his memory as an educator, contributing member of the community and advocate for lifelong learning.

## **Eligibility:**

- Entry is open to children/dependents of all term and permanent employees (or retirees) who completed Level III of high school in June 2023.
  - Applicants must be enrolled in a full-time program of study at a post-secondary school beginning in September 2023.

# Frequently Asked Questions

**Q. *Who can apply for Family Scholarships?***

**A.** Family Scholarships are awarded to children/dependents of term and permanent employees and retirees who completed Level III of High School in June 2023 and are enrolled in a full-time program of study at a post-secondary school beginning in September 2023.

**Q. *How many scholarships will be awarded in 2023?***

**A.** A maximum of 17 scholarships of \$1,000 each will be awarded based on established criteria as defined.

**Q. *Are scholarship awards based on financial need?***

**A.** No. Most scholarship awards are based on academic achievement and the applicant's community/volunteer work. The Jennifer Snow Memorial Scholarship is awarded based solely on academic achievement.

**Q. *Who decides how scholarships are awarded?***

**A.** The scholarships will be judged by an internal selection committee.

**Q. *How are academic averages determined?***

**A.** The highest average in any four, core 3000 level subject areas (science, English, math and social studies) will be recorded to determine the academic average of each applicant.

\*\*For the Jennifer Snow Memorial Scholarship, the academic average will be calculated, to the nearest tenth, in any five senior high school courses which are subject to public exams. If advanced courses are offered, then one of the five courses being considered must be an advanced course.

**Q. *Can scholarship decisions be appealed?***

**A.** No. Scholarship awards are based on criteria established by the internal selection committee and all decisions will be final.

**Q. *Can multiple family members submit an application during the same year?***

**A.** Yes. Term and permanent employees and retirees may have multiple dependents submit applications as long as each applicant has completed Level III of High School in June 2023 and is enrolled in a full-time program of study at a post-secondary school beginning in September 2023.



***Q. Can parts of the application be submitted at different times as long as all information is in by the deadline?***

**A.** All information to be considered as part of the application, must be submitted together. Information received with the application form will be considered as the entire submission and will be evaluated solely on that information.

***Q. Will scholarships be payable to the applicant if they decide to forgo entering a post-secondary school?***

**A.** No. The scholarship is designed to assist recipients with expenses associated with attending post-secondary institutions (tuition, required registration, etc.). Attendance/enrollment will be confirmed with successful applicants prior to payment.

***Q. Can students of Eric G. Lambert School apply for all of the scholarships, or only for the Jennifer Snow Memorial and Steve Power Memorial scholarships?***

**A.** Students of E.G. Lambert School may apply for all scholarships, however, individuals are only eligible to receive one scholarship.

***Q. When will I find out if my application has been successful?***

**A.** Applicants will be notified if they have been successful in receiving a scholarship before the end of October 2023. Recipients of the Bright Futures, Jennifer Snow Memorials and Steve Power Memorial Scholarships will receive cheques no later than the end of December 2023. For the Rick Leggo Memorial Scholarship, payment will be automatically deposited to the student's account at the post-secondary institution they are attending, prior to the January 2024 term.
